**LOGAN COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT
ADOPT-A-ROAD / ADOPT-AN-AREA PROGRAM
ADOPTION PERMIT, TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

The Logan County Solid Waste Management District, referred to as the “District”, and the volunteer group named _____, referred to as the “Group”, recognize the need and the desirability of litter-free areas and this permit is being issued to allow the group to contribute toward the effort of maintaining litter-free areas as part of the District plan.

By signature below, the Group acknowledges the hazardous nature of the work and agrees to the following terms and conditions:

1. A Group shall adopt a section of roadway that is at least two miles long.
2. The Group is required to adopt for a two-year period. After two years, the Group may renew the adoption agreement. The Group shall notify the District should unforeseen circumstances require the Group to terminate this agreement early.
3. The Group shall pick up litter a minimum of twice each year; more times if roadside litter build-up warrants more attention.
4. Groups must notify the District within five working days before a clean-up to arrange for materials and supplies. The District will furnish gloves, vests, trash bags, litter tools, and traffic signs on request. These materials must be returned as soon as the pick-up is completed.
5. The Group must notify the District as soon as a clean-up is finished to identify the location of the bagged litter and confirm the clean-up effort. The District will pick up bagged litter, sort it to recover recyclable materials, and properly dispose of it promptly.
6. The Group shall conduct a safety briefing each time a clean-up is conducted. Participants must sign the SAFETY AGREEMENT, the ASSUMPTION OF RISK and RELEASE before participating in the event. Supervisors must enforce SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS (RULES).
7. Work is restricted to one hour after sunrise to one hour before sunset. No work shall be performed under conditions of restricted visibility. (fog, snow, rain etc.)
8. Traffic control signs supplied by the District will be placed by the Group during trash pick-up operations, if the Group so desires, or if the District deems it necessary for certain roads.
9. No parking of any vehicle is permitted on the roadway portion of any township, county, or state routes. “Roadway means the portion of a highway improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, except the berm or shoulders. (ORC 4511.01)
10. All vehicles shall be parked beyond the shoulder. Group operations shall not restrict or interfere with the safe and convenient use of the roadway by the traveling public. All persons involved shall be dressed with a bright orange vest or garment for safety purposes.
11. Any group containing young persons, under 18 years of age, must have a minimum ratio of one (1) adult for each six (6) persons under the age of 18. Persons under the age of 12 years of age are prohibited from participating in the roadway adoption program. Groups with younger children may adopt safe areas to clean, such as parks or cemeteries.
12. Example of adoption areas are county and township roads, fairgrounds, parks, school grounds, and river/lake banks. Approval of adoption areas will be guided by age of participants, location and safety.
